This year, about 7,000 young people will see the world the way it is meant to be seen — from the inside out — through a Rotary Youth Exchange program. This could be your year!

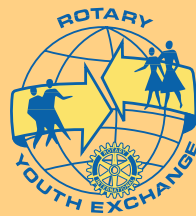

What is Rotary?

Rotary is the world's oldest service club organization. Members representing a cross section of the community's business and professional leaders meet weekly in clubs that are non-political and open to all cultures, races, and creeds.

With "Service Above Self" as their motto, Rotary clubs provide service in the community, workplace, and throughout the world. Rotarians encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and build goodwill and peace through programs like Youth Exchange.

Rotary Youth Exchange is administered by Rotary clubs and districts. With more than 29,500 clubs worldwide, an extensive network of volunteers is ready to ensure the necessary support for the program. Rotary clubs have sponsored successful international youth exchanges for more than 30 years.

Who is eligible?

Rotary Youth Exchange programs are open to qualified students ages 15-19, relatives of Rotarians and non-Rotarians alike. To qualify, applicants should be above-average students who demonstrate leadership in their community. Candidates should also possess qualities which will enable them to become excellent cultural ambassadors, such as flexibility and a willingness to try new things. All applicants must be sponsored by a local Rotary club and complete a written application and oral interview.

How much will it cost?

Because Rotary Youth Exchange is administered by Rotary clubs and districts, only your local club or district will have specific information regarding costs. Typically, the student and his/her parents or guardians are responsible for:

- ✦ Round-trip airfare to the host country.
- ✦ Health and accident insurance acceptable to the host club and district.
- ✦ All travel documents, such as passports and visas.
- ✦ Clothing and spending money.
- ✦ An emergency fund for your use during the year.



What are my responsibilities?

- ✦ Agree to abide by all program rules of your host Rotary club and district.
- ✦ Accept the supervision of the host district, host club, and host family.
- ✦ Act as an ambassador of your own country.
- ✦ Be open to new experiences and cultural differences.

Where will I go?

Youth Exchanges may take place wherever Rotary clubs exist. Contact your local Rotary club for more information on where its programs operate and whether or not you may select a specific country. Wherever you go, you will discover that the world is smaller than you once thought, and that you can gain a great deal from the unique experience of being a Rotary Youth Exchange participant.
