After this start you'll "meet" the Danish Vikings and the Viking-king Harold Bluetooth who gathered Denmark and Norway and made the Danes Christian, as it is written on the big runic stone.

You'll also have a look into the Danish Middle-age and of course you'll meet with Denmark as it is today, and there will be time for being together in order to promote international understanding.

Short term program July 28th – August 10th - 2014

Date	Program
Monday July 28th	Arrivals. Rotary-members meet you at Vejle Traffic-Center or Billund Airport. Lodging and welcome at Vingsted Mølle. (See photos)
Tuesday 29th	"Travel" back to the Iron-ages (500 BC – 750 AC) Lodging at the chief's farm. Workshops and cooking. Cosy evening with bonfire, singing and storytelling. Overnight stay in the Iron –age houses (See photos)
Wednesday. 30th	Workshops in the Iron-age continued. Overnight stay in the Iron-age houses.
Thursday. 31st	Ending of the Workshops in the Iron-ages. Back to Vingsted Mølle.
Friday Aug, 1st	The Viking ages (750 -1050 AC). The Kings' Jelling with the Runic Stones. Sail with a Viking ship on lake Fårup. (See photos)
Saturday. 2nd	2 by 2 at homestay with Rotary-members
Sunday. 3rd	Bus-trip to Ribe, a merchant-town in both the Viking-ages and the Middle-ages (1050 – 1500 AC). (See photos)
Monday. 4th	Bike-trip in the neighbourhood to Bindeballe where you can go fishing.
Tuesday. 5th	Bike-trip to Vejle. Sightseeing and shopping in Vejle.
Wednesday 6th	Bustrip to the Westcoast of Jutland. Bork, Holmsland Klit, Nr. Lyngvig , Ringkøbing. Sightseeing and swimming. (See photos)
Thursday 7th	Visit "Legoland"
Friday 8th	A day on your own.
Saturday 9th	Preparing evening feast in the Iron-age environment together with Rotary-members.
Sunday 10th	Departure

Accommodation: Bring a sleeping-bag for use in the Iron-age environment.
At Vingsted Mølle there will be bed clothes for you.

Insurance: The guests are expected to bring their own insurance (health, risks and accidents).

Costs: The guests pay for their own trip to/from Vejle Traffic Centre or Billund Airport from where pick-up will be arranged. All other expenses are paid for by the Rotary Club, but you must bring your own pocket-money.

Further a participation fee of DKK 500 (about 70 Euro) will be collected by the “Camp Leader” on the arrival day.
